Partnering to manage complex data and systems and achieve compliance with new FDA requirements

BACKGROUND

To protect patients from counterfeit pharmaceuticals, the Drug Supply Chain Security Act (DSCSA) established an electronic system for package-level tracing of prescription drugs throughout the supply chain. The Food & Drug Administration required pharmaceutical dispensers, including 135 Ascension sites of care, to adopt this electronic tracing system by November 2025. AscensionRx partnered with The Resource Group in 2023 for support to ensure compliance by the deadline.



SOLUTION

The Resource Group managed three critical areas:

- 1. Vendor & Technical Setup:** Delivered timely communications to vendors and collected necessary information to establish medication serialization data feeds.
- 2. Stakeholder Alignment:** Collaborated with pharmacy operational teams, legal counsel, and the distributor to ensure compliance, training, and adherence to the legislation.
- 3. Data Management:** Established a managed Global Location Number program, assigning and rostering updated Global Location Numbers for the Ascension sites of care to enhance product traceability.
